Jean Lipman-Blumen is the Thornton F. Bradshaw professor of public policy and professor of organizational behavior at the Drucker School. Lipman-Blumen’s areas of expertise include leadership, achieving styles, crisis management, organizational behavior, and gender roles. Her current research focuses on connective leadership in a diverse and interdependent world, why followers tolerate toxic leaders, and a practical theory of crisis management.

Lipman-Blumen is a co-founding director of the Institute for Advanced Studies in Leadership at the Drucker School. She has served as assistant director of the National Institute of Education, as special advisor to the domestic policy staff in the White House under President Carter, and as consultant to various governments and private-sector organizations.

Lipman-Blumen has published six books, three monographs, and more than 85 articles on leadership, followership, public policy, management, crisis management, and gender issues. *The Connective Edge: Leading in an Interdependent World* was nominated for a Pulitzer Prize. *Hot Groups: Seeding Them, Feeding Them, and Using Them to Ignite Your Organization*, with Harold J. Leavitt, professor emeritus, Stanford Graduate School of Business, was the Association of American Publishers’ “Business Book of the Year.” *The Allure of Toxic Leaders: Why We Follow Destructive Bosses and Corrupt Politicians—and How We Can Survive*

John Hope Bryant is the founder, chairman, and CEO of Operation HOPE, which has served more than 1 million individuals and has raised more than \$500 million over the past 17 years to empower the poor and the under-served with silver rights, financial literacy, dignity, hope, and access to capital, opportunity, and ownership. Operation HOPE is the only national urban delivery system for financial literacy empowerment in the U.S., operating in 68 urban communities and six provinces in South Africa.

He is also financial literacy advisor to the World Economic Forum Global Agenda Council and author of *Love Leadership: A New Way to Lead in a Fear-Based World* (Jossey-Bass), debuting in August 2009 at No. 8 on the CEO Reads Top 10 Bestseller List.
